* Constitution & By-Laws – Unable to complete review in 2018 as Andrew Huculak withdrew as Committee Chair and issue was not followed up on. The new Executive to create new committee asking for a new chair with governance experience and new documents are to conform to the Non-profit By-Laws. David MacDougall said new Constitution should be kept simple and the items specifying special items like standing committees should be removed.

New Business

* Standing Committees be reinstated as per current Constitution and By-Laws. Kathy requested that previous committees such as Membership, Social, Social Media, Newsletter, and Communications (Gmail account) be re-instated to take some of the workload off the current Executive members such as the Secretary position. Invite dignitaries; RMC members; March 16th or 15th (not the 17th as the dancers are booked); large venue; entertainment/high end. Kid's invited, but it is a licensed event. A venue must be booked as soon as possible as the dates are 3 ½ months away!

Mosaic 2019.

The Callie is not available, India & Chile have it booked. It will be available for 2020 and they want to do the catering for it. I have phoned everywhere I can think of for a venue for 2019 and haven't been successful in finding a place. Application for a Pavilion has to be in to RMC by the first week in December, so as of today there will not be an Irish Pavilion in 2019.

There are other problems with having a Pavilion finding a caterer and shortage of volunteers. Calgary started a new Feis and it will always be the same weekend as Mosaic, making it difficult to get volunteers and entertainment as many of the dancers from Prairie Gael and Blakey and parents would be away.

Costs are up, attendance is down and people are not spending as much because of strict laws on drinking and driving. 2016 we lost about \$9000 and 2017 we broke even, no Pavilion in 2018. Scottish invited dancers to dance at their Pavilion in 2018.

The Executive suggested asking Scottish to join us and have a Celtic Pavilion. This is not an option as per the Scottish Club. If anyone has any suggestions/ideas we would love to hear them.

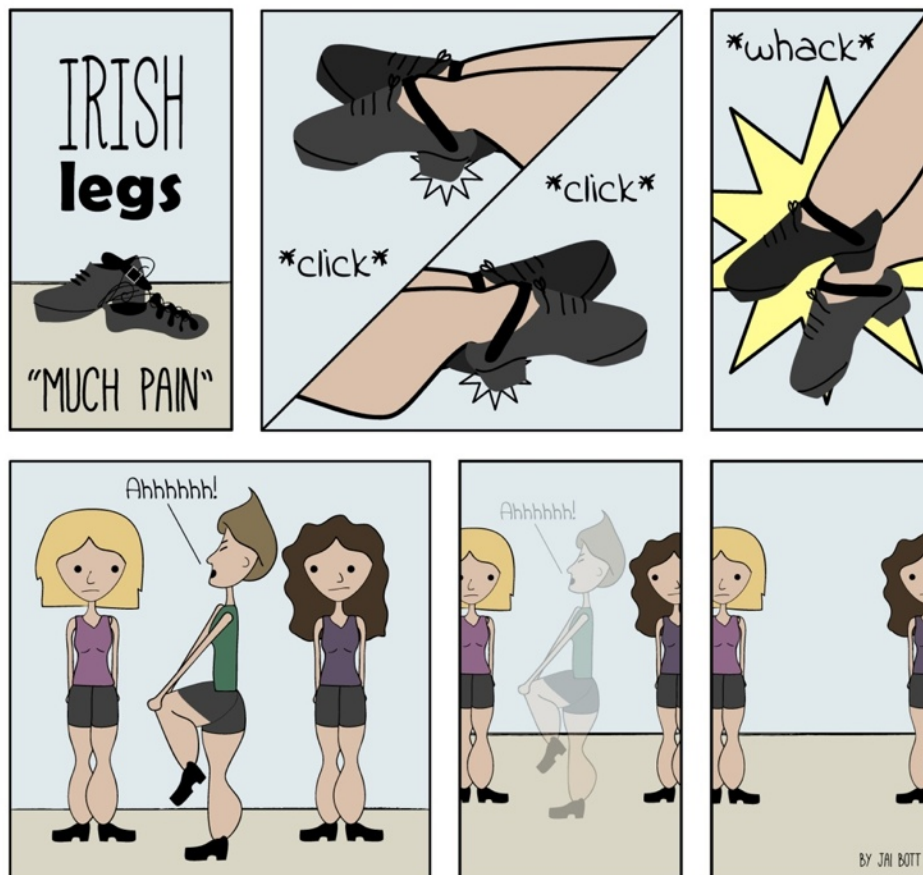
The dancers themselves will be having a party to celebrate, all dancing together as a group and then heading out for pizza. We will take a short break for the holiday, and then back to dance we go!

The dance year for the Blakey School of Irish Dance started out with our first classes on September 9th at our new studio space at 1630 Albert Street. We are excited for our new space and with classes running Sunday, Monday, Tuesday and Thursday, "The Hive" is a busy place!!



The first feisanna of the year was the River City Feis held in Saskatoon on September 15 & 16. We had 10 Regina Blakey dancers participate in the competition. Special mention goes to both Sierra Davis Fiacco and Rayka Subramanian for winning their second Preliminary Championship. Both these dancers have now moved into Open Championships. The Blakey Regina Team achieved 7 podium placings. Awesome job girls!

Several of our dancers attended the 2nd Feisanna of the fall dance season in Calgary on Thanksgiving weekend. This was the inaugural year for Casey O'Loughlin feis and was enjoyed by all who attended. We had 8 dancers from Blakey Regina attend. Special mention goes to Emma Kasian who placed 1st in both her Treble Jig Trophies and has moved into Preliminary Championships. There were 13 podium placements for the Regina Blakey team!!

Our dancers were invited to participate in the 1st Southland Fest at centre court in the Southland Mall on September 21 & 22nd. This event showcased various vendors and entertainment in the mall to bring the community together. Our dancers had 2 sets on Friday and 2 on Saturday and for some of our new dancers this was their first performance!!

We are pleased to report the results from the Western Canadian Oireachtas! The World and North American Qualifier was held November 17th & 18th, 2018 in Edmonton, AB. We had 9 dancers represent Blakey Saskatchewan with 8 of these dancers from the Regina branch which is the largest group that we have had from this location at this qualifier! Ayva Purdue was our youngest dancer and competed in the 8 - 9 age group in her first Oireachtas! Aly Woolsey in the 9-10 and Emma Kaisan in the 13-14 group competed for the first time with Aly receiving a recall and finishing 11th. Rayka Subramanian competed in the 10-11 age category and received a recall placing 11th. Sierra Davis Fiacco and Aobha MacLoone competed in the 13-14 age category with Sierra receiving a recall and placing 21st. Jenna McEwen competed in the 18-19 group receiving a recall and placing 7th. Megan Beach and Laura Schaan competed in the Senior Ladies 20-22 with Megan receiving a recall and finishing 10th. Due to their achievements at Oireachtas, the following dancers have qualified for the North American Championships (Nationals): Aly, Rayka, Sierra, Aobha, Jenna, Megan and Laura. This experience will be very special for those attending, as this event will be held in Vancouver, BC in July 2019.

Our dancers have done several performances in the months of October and November – Wintergreen Estates, Regina Lutheran Home and Green Falls Landing. Our dancers have a special performance at the Mackenzie Art Gallery Holiday Celebration on December 9th at 2:00 pm. This is an open event, so come out and see them perform.
